Organic Gardener's Section

Most organic gardeners grow vegetables for taste and freshness and so this section is for them.

If you do not use chemical fertilisers or chemical pest control on your garden then you are welcome to enter.

1 Tastiest Potatoes

3 potatoes cooked on their skins in unsalted water. Please provide the name of the variety.

2 Tastiest Carrots

3 carrots with an inch of tops left on, scrubbed clean so that the judges can nibble.

3 Tomatoes

Category 1:- Your choice of variety can be judged on appearance and taste. 3 fruits.

Category 2:- Unusual varieties - 2 tomatoes, judged on appearance only.

4 Tastiest Cucumbers

One example, any variety

5 Tastiest Apples

Three apples of a named variety

6 Organic Selection

Presented in a bowl, basket or any suitable container (which will not be judged). Quality, variety and unusualness of the selection will be judged rather than taste.

Category 1:- Individual entry

Category 2:- Group entry

General Section

Suitable for both organic and conventionally grown produce.

7 Legumes

Peas, beans, etc. 4 pods. We are looking for general quality and freshness.

8 Herbs

Culinary or aromatic herbs in a bunch or posy.

9 Onions

Category 1:- Colour, shape, firmness will be judged. 3 bulbs.

Category 2:- The strongest onion in the show. The tear test will be applied scientifically.

10 Squashes

Pumpkin, squash or courgette family of vegetables.

Category 1:- size

Category 2:- unusualness and good looks.

11 Potatoes

3 of the same, uncooked. Looking for unusualness and good looks.

12 Fruit

3 pieces of fruit - all the same or different.

13 Any Other Vegetable

To be judged on the traditional criteria including size.

NB. For all of the above section (except for flowers and herbs) please present on a clean white plate (paper or china)

Young Gardeners ☺

Judged in three age groups: a) under 5s b) at primary school c) at secondary school

14 A Model

Animal or figure made out of vegetables and fruits as crazy or artistic as you like. You can make this in the vegetable modelling workshop on the day and this class will be judged later in the afternoon

What's This? ☺

If you've not entered any of the above classes then these are the classes for you!

15 Garden Freak

One fruit or vegetable of unusual appearance - a weird shape or strange colour perhaps.

Maybe it looks like someone you know? If so, Bring it along for a photo.

16 Compost Corner

Back again by popular demand. Bring along a sample from your own heap or composter in a 4 inch plant pot for our judges to sample.

NB. good compost should only have a faint, pleasant smell.

17 Anti Veg. Show!

Make your protest here with the bendiest carrot or bean, the most slug infested lettuce, the smallest onion or the emptiest pea pod. Your failure could be your success.

Home Made Produce

18 Preserves

Jams, jellies, pickles, chutneys or honey. The main ingredients should be produced by yourself.

Category 1:- Savoury

Category 2:- Sweet

19 Bread

Homemade & judged on taste and appearance.

20 Home Baked Produce ☺

Any savoury or sweet product from your own oven including cakes, biscuits, pasties & pies. Judged on taste and appearance.

Category 1:- Savoury

Category 2:- Sweety

21 Best Decorated Cake ☺

Looks count in this one, so make it fun & bold!



Sections marked with a ☺ are especially suitable for children

In all classes or categories, at least one first prize will be awarded.

The Judges' decisions are final.

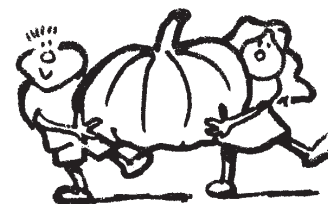
